



Student Nurse and Midwife access to HEPMA

HEPMA is Hospital Electronic Prescribing and Medicines Administration. This is a new digital system that is currently being rolled-out across NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde. It replaces the paper drug chart (kardex) for inpatient areas across our hospital sites.

As a Nursing or Midwifery student you may be required to access HEPMA whilst out on placement. To access the HEPMA system you will require an active XGGC account and a HEPMA account.

It is vital that you keep your XGGC account active throughout your training. Further guidance regarding IT access can be found on our student IT access Fact Sheet.

HEPMA Account - To obtain an account for HEPMA you will need to complete the training module which takes approximately 30 minutes. Select link: [HEPMA Module on TURAS](#)

Once you have completed the HEPMA Nursing module on TURAS your completion certificate will appear in your Learning History. Proof of completion of the module will be needed when attending your NHSGGC placement. This can be provided electronically (for example via phone) or via a printed copy which you can store in your Practice assessment Document for future placements.

IT will provide your HEPMA log in details via your university, you cannot use this log in until you have completed the TURAS module.

Please note you will only need to complete the HEPMA module once as you will use the same login throughout your training.
