### Future Care Planning: ACP Focus On...

As you know, teams across GGC have been auditing a selection of completed ACP's in each HSCP. The results have been really positive - thank you to everyone involved. It's also been a great learning opportunity and we've identified a few areas that need a bit more clarification:

#### Family Understanding

Good to involve where possible with a simple sentence such as "the family have been involved in these discussions and are happy with the plan" under special notes section.





Power of Attorney ACP goes hand in hand with Power of Attorney and will include the decisions the person has made - record all POA details or if not in place, a note under special notes to state it's been discussed.

#### Treatment Escalation

Think about framing questions around the most common deterioration situations where people are most often unnecessarily admitted to hospital. What are their views on going to hospital or do they wish to stay at home and be treated?

#### Communication Needs

Note these in the 'special notes' section of the ACP. Does someone need prompts or aids to fully particpate in decision about their future care and treatment? Or someone to support them? This is good to know in an emergency situation.
