

From Principles to Practice: Embedding Anti-Racism in Nursing and Midwifery (webinar)

Racism and other forms of discrimination not only affect people receiving care, but also many midwifery and nursing professionals who provide it. The Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) has launched new anti-racism principles to urgently tackle the health inequities experienced by racially minoritised people, including staff.
