We are excited to share the new 'Care Home Digest' guideline from the British Dietetic Association (BDA).



New Wound Guidance Poster



This new guidance for non-progressing wounds was developed by colleagues from care homes and HSCPs.

All wounds should show signs of progress over a two week period (evidence of progress towards healing, reduced size, reduction in slough and necrotic tissue).

If this does not happen then the guidance provides a clear decision making pathway for care home staff /care home liaison nurses, to ensure referrals are streamlined to Podiatry and Tissue Viability.

All steps in the guidance should be completed before making a referral to the next stage.


