

SPAR Launch at Kincaid House

On Thursday 20th February, the team at Kincaid House care home in Greenock launched the palliative indicator tool SPAR (Supportive and Palliative Action Register). This tool provides a structured approach to early identification of change/decline in residents and also acts as a communication tool to seek timely support. The launch celebrated a period of intensive training for staff to enable them to start using this tool effectively.

An afternoon of tea and cakes accompanied lots of conversations with relatives about how this tool can help them feel confident that staff notice change and decline in their loved ones.



MUST and MUST Step 5 webinars


In June 2024 the Care Home Dietetic Team introduced digital training sessions on MUST and MUST Step 5 aiming to increase the accessibility for teams across the area.

There have been six sessions with a total of 211 staff from 38 care homes attending. Due to the uptake of this we are now introducing these webinars every six weeks.

This one-hour training session helps to refresh knowledge of each step of the MUST screening tool, including calculation of scores. It will also cover MUST Step 5 and explain how to complete the form.


