

Food, Fluid and Nutrition Champion - Oakview Manor Care Home, Glasgow

Shyvon, Care Manager and Nutrition Champion in Oakview Manor Care Home in Glasgow, expressed an interest in promoting key messages on nutrition and hydration with her team and colleagues. She requested some support with resources to run small training sessions within the home. The FFN team and Care Home Dietitians created bite size resources and provided training to help Shyvon develop the peer to peer sessions. These include food fortification, hydration, making a good mealtime experience and Dysphagia/IDDSI management.



Shyvon has a passion for good FFN interventions for her residents and is excited to pilot the Nutritional Trainer model with weekly bite sized training sessions scheduled in the home during October 2023. The team hope to be able to roll this model out to other care homes in the future.


