Topics in this Core Brief:

Testing of Asymptomatic Staff

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The Scottish Government have introduced additional measures to ensure that we continue to provide as safe an environment as possible for our patients and staff through minimising the risk of infection from COVID-19.

From 8 July 2020 we will be undertaking weekly testing for asymptomatic healthcare staff in areas where we are caring for vulnerable patients. This is for those working in specialist oncology and day patient wards including radiotherapy, long term care of the elderly wards, and long term care wards in mental health facilities. Testing will include all staff who are physically present on the ward.

Samples will be collected by relevant colleagues in each area and sent off for testing. Your manager will make arrangements for this to take place and advise you accordingly.

The diagram below sets out the testing process:



If you test positive you will also be contacted by the Test and Protect service, who will forward your details to Occupational Health for further assessment. If you have already had a positive test for COVID-19 then you do not need to be tested

It is requested that staff in these vulnerable areas participate in the weekly testing programme, ensuring that we meet our professional standards in placing public protection at the heart of what we do, and that patient safety and confidence is maintained.
