Reviewing Staff COVID Infections

If you have a staff member(s) who tests or has tested positive for COVID-19 please ensure you follow the <u>Guidance on RIDDOR and COVID-19 – update</u>. The flowchart on page 8 has been provided to assist in decision making.

We have a statutory obligation to report work related COVID infections to the Health and Safety Executive in line with the Reporting of Injuries, Diseases, and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 2013 (RIDDOR). The guidance document has been developed to support local investigations.

How to access Lateral Flow Device testing kits

Hospital-based staff

Test kits were distributed via our line management structures. Staff who meet the criteria for Lateral Flow Device testing should discuss with their line manager how and when to access a test kit particularly if you are new to the team or your kit is due for renewal.

Community staff

Lateral Flow Device testing kits were provided via the Health and Social Care Partnership PPE hubs. Your manager will be aware of this and can provide necessary guidance. Staff who meet the criteria for Lateral Flow Device testing should discuss with their line manager how and when to access a test kit. Kits were also distributed to the Community Assessment Centres and GP OOHs.

Bank Workers and Vaccinators

If you are a bank only worker you can get a kit from West Glasgow Bank Services by calling 0141 278 2555. If you're employed as a vaccinator kits are being made available as part of your orientation programme.

More than 150 years on from pioneering work that led to the discovery of antiseptic surgery, the life and legacy of Joseph Lister is being celebrated by The Friends of Glasgow Royal Infirmary, a new charity set up in May 2020 to celebrate the history of the place where Lister's work took place.

Lister week, in association with the RCPSG, will be the charity's very first event and will be held virtually and be freely available to anyone who is interested. Lister week will run from 22 to 26 February with daily presentations, a virtual exhibition and a Twitter takeover from the acclaimed author and medical historian, Lindsey Fitzharris.

John Stuart, who started his nurse training in the GRI and who recently retired as Chief Nurse of the North Sector after a career of almost 40 years, is one of the founding members of the charity. Together with three of his colleagues, Dr Morven McElroy, Dr Hilary Wilson and Dr Kate Stevens, he came up with the idea for Lister week.
