New HEPMA Reporting Dashboards Now Available on Microstrategy

From Thursday 7 July all HEPMA clinical users will have access to five new Reporting Dashboards on Microstrategy via this link.

These dashboards are designed to help with the clinical care of patients and are the first in a planned series to be rolled out to users.

The five dashboards are:

Missed doses summary – A summary by week of missed doses for a selected area, including the reason recorded for non-administration of a dose

Antimicrobial summary report – A summary by ward of IV and oral antimicrobial therapy with duration. Red / amber / green is used to highlight patients who have been on IV or oral antimicrobial therapy for an extended period.

Non-formulary drug use - A report of non-formulary prescribing within an area, by drug, area or user

Lithium patients – a summary of all current inpatients on Lithium treatment with e-GFR, creatinine and Lithium level status

Allergy Status – a summary of all current inpatients with 'Undetermined' allergy status, by ward.

The dashboards will be updated at least twice daily.
