Listening to our patients

Listening to our patients, their families, and carers, and understanding their experiences of care is extremely important to NHSGGC. Care Opinion is one of the feedback mechanisms that helps us achieve this.

Care Opinion is an independent organisation and website where patients, families, and carers can share their feedback about their healthcare experiences (<u>https://www.careopinion.org.uk</u>). The feedback we receive provides us with the opportunity to learn from those who use our services, understand what is working well, and identify areas for improvement.

Some highlights from June 2025 are shown below, with 'staff' being the most frequently used tag to describe what was good about our services. The key themes from the word cloud are our staff, the care they provide and their professionalism.

- > 256 patients, relatives and carers shared their feedback via Care Opinion.
- 77% of these stories were from patients and service users.
- > 79% of feedback was positive.
- > These stories have been viewed on Care Opinion 18,848 times.

Warm weather guidance for staff this weekend

With warm weather expected this weekend and highs of 30 degrees, staff are encouraged to stay safe both in the sun and at work in high temperatures.

Our Top Tips for the Weekend:

- **Sunburn and sunstroke** Always cover up in the sun to protect yourself and your family from burns and heat exhaustion. This includes wearing a high-factor sunscreen, appropriate clothing, and spending time in the shade.
- **Medicines** Ensure you have over-the-counter medicines available for common illnesses, including paracetamol or ibuprofen, remedies for bites and stings, and antihistamines for allergies.
- First aid Keep a first aid kit in your home with plasters, bandages, and antiseptic wipes for cuts, as well as an ice pack for minor strains or sprains.
- **Food poisoning** Barbecuing can lead to food poisoning if it is not done correctly. Ensure meat is cooked thoroughly and evenly and keep cooked and raw food separate.

Dr Emilia Crighton, Director of Public Health, said: "This weekend is looking like a great time to get outside for warmer weather.

"No matter what you're doing, please enjoy the good weather safely by protecting yourself when in the sun, staying hydrated, and having common medicines to hand."
