Medical Mentoring Course: Dates: 8 October, 9 October and 29 October.

Overview

Over three-days, the Medical Mentoring course will provide participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to become effective mentors. Mentors help their colleagues deal with dilemmas, challenges and opportunities to help them move forward in a way which suits the individual.

Learning outcomes:

- To understand what mentoring is, what it isn't, and how it can help your colleagues
- To develop the skills and techniques required to mentor successfully, using Egan's 'The Skilled Helper' model as a framework
- To establish an understanding of good practice when undertaking mentoring.

Who is this course for?

This course is suitable for Consultants, SAS and Senior Trainees within NHSGGC. Following successful completion of the course, participants are encouraged to continue developing their mentoring skills by joining the GCG Medical Mentoring Network.
