NHSGGC has seen an increase in respiratory viruses over the past few weeks. Staff are reminded that for the protection of everyone, the IPCT advise a FRSM is worn at all times in all clinical areas. Masks should only be removed while eating or drinking.

Staff are also reminded the **ALL** staff are required to wear FRSM when advised by IPCT as part of outbreak control measures or as part of TBPs where the patient has a confirmed/suspected respiratory virus.
