Message from Scottish Ambulance Service

This is an important message to advise that when requesting a Patient Transport Service appointment from the Scottish Ambulance Service, the call handler will no longer recap the request at the end of the call, as has been done previously.

With Covid-19 restrictions easing and more hospital appointments being allocated, the Scottish Ambulance Service has seen a significant increase in Scheduled Care appointments. Their staff are working extremely hard to accommodate this increase and by removing the recap, which allows more bookings to be processed.

To help you in the process, please ensure the correct details are given during the time of the booking. A booking form has been <u>attached</u> (please note you will need to open the link in Microsoft Edge) which provides guidance to all the information required to make an appointment.

We would also like to remind to please use the Health Board priority number on 0333 399 0044 for any bookings, please do not give this number out to any patients.
