## Launch of falls strategy and guidelines

The safety and wellbeing of our patients and communities is a top priority for NHSGGC, with falls being a common problem within our older population, and one third of over 65's and half of over 80's having a fall every year. However, falls are not inevitable and there are many things that we can do across the health and social care system to reduce the risk of people falling – allowing them to continue to live well and continue doing what they love.

To help tackle this we are launching two important documents:

Staying Safe, Strong and Steady – Our Falls Prevention and Management Strategy contains our five-year approach to improving some key aspects of falls prevention and management. By taking a whole system approach and encouraging evidence based practice across our communities and services within NHSGGC it is hoped the devastating effect falls have on the older person can be lessened and we can facilitate people to live more active and independent lives in their communities.



Prevention and Management of In-patient Falls,
 Adults aged 16 and over provides information on the prevention and management of inpatient falls allowing our staff to be able to identify and manage risk as effectively as possible whilst promoting independence whenever possible.

## We would like your feedback on the winter 2023 vaccination programme
