Involving our patients, their families and carers, through active listening to and learning from their experience of care is extremely important to NHSGGC. Earlier in 2023 teams across NHSGGC and the six Health and Social Care Partnerships shared how they have involved people in their work. In July, we published the Engagement and Involvement Overview report.

To help shine a light on the excellent work carried out by these teams, the Communications and Public Engagement Directorate have developed a new section of the <u>NHSGGC.scot website</u>. West of Scotland Adult Cystic Fibrosis Service: Video Call Fatigue

- Worked with PEPI to engage patients on the changes to the outpatient model delivered remotely during COVID-19 restrictions.
- The patient engagement work undertaken by the team was also showcased as an example of good practice at the 46th European Cystic Fibrosis Conference in Vienna in June 2023.

Glasgow City HSCP: Engaging on a Primary Care Improvement Plan (PCIP)

- Engaging with stakeholders was a valuable opportunity for Primary Care contractors, staff and patients to share their thoughts and suggestions for improving primary care services within Glasgow City HSCP.
- Engagement with the public and wider stakeholders was invaluable to the service in shaping the development of the PCIP.
