Mobile vaccination bus offering Pertussis/MMR vaccination

The mobile vaccination bus will be out next week to offer Pertussis/MMR to staff. JCVI has advised that health professionals who have not received a pertussis-containing vaccine in the last five years and have regular contact with pregnant women and/or young infants (young infants are those under three months of age) are eligible for vaccination.
