Clean Air Day Webinar - 16 June 2022 - 12noon - 1.30pm

Global Action Plan (GAP) is the charity behind the UK's biggest day of the year in the fight against air pollution - Clean Air Day. This year it takes place on the 16 June. With support from the Scottish Government, GAP is hosting a learning and discussion webinar for healthcare staff to highlight the health effects of Air Pollution on our population, while also considering what advice we can give to our patients. The session will be led by Dr Malcolm White, a Glasgow-based medical registrar who has recently begun working with GAP.
