Involving our patients

Meaningful engagement with patients, their families, and caregivers is a core aspect of service delivery in NHSGGC. By working with these groups, we can use their invaluable experiences to shape and enhance our services together. In 2023, various teams across NHSGGC, along with our six Health and Social Care Partnerships, came together to highlight their efforts in engaging communities. This collaboration culminated in the publication of the Engagement and Involvement Overview report in July.

From this report we have extracted short case studies to help shine a light on the excellent work being carried out across the board, throughout the year, in the hope of providing a source of inspiration for future initiatives. Chronic Pain Service: Engaging Black and Minority Ethnic Communities
The NHSGGC Chronic Pain Management and Diabetes services, in collaboration
with the Equalities and Human Rights Team, embarked on a targeted engagement
initiative to improve service accessibility for BME communities.

• Through interviews and group discussions involving 39 participants from BME backgrounds, the services gathered valuable feedback on barriers to access and understanding of the services offered.

• This led to significant improvements in service delivery, including enhanced multi-language support and more accessible, easy-to-understand systems.

Glasgow Royal Infirmary Dietician Service: Pictorial Care Evaluation In an innovative approach to gathering patient feedback, dieticians at Glasgow Royal Infirmary undertook a trial using abbreviated pictorial care measures.

- This trial focused on simplifying the feedback process for patients on the major trauma ward, receiving 20 pieces of feedback.
- The initiative showed a creative method for capturing patient experiences, contributing to the ongoing improvement of patient care and staff development.
