First Minister thanks NHS workers as she receives winter vaccinations

First Minister Nicola Sturgeon <u>thanks staff</u> who are delivering the vaccination programme for the excellent job they are doing, as she received her COVID and flu vaccines at Glasgow Central Mosque Vaccination Centre.

She encourages everyone who is in an eligible group for vaccination to get your vaccination as soon as possible, as it is just as important now as it was last year or the earlier days of COVID.

Staff can arrange an appointment at any centre if you work in Greater Glasgow and Clyde and you live elsewhere. Carers Rights Day 2022 – 24 November 2022

During the week leading up to Carers Rights Day, we are running various information sessions for both staff and the public.

There will be two sessions on "Preparing for Hospital" which is for anyone who is worried about what might happen if they, or someone they support, is admitted to our wards. These sessions will take place on MS Teams on (click on the date to register):

There will also be two sessions looking at the legal duties of staff working in acute, community and/or primary care. Staff can contact the NHSGGC <u>Support and Information Service</u> (SIS) for help with money worries and other issues, such as being a carer. Staff can also refer patients in Acute services to the SIS or patients in community settings to money advice services – see our <u>Money Worries</u> page for details.
