I am delighted to announce that Clydebank Health and Care Centre has won two awards at the Building Better Healthcare annual awards ceremony this week. Beating tough competition from across the UK, the centre was recognised as the Best Healthcare Development under £25 million and also won the Best Collaborative Arts Project (Static) for the Our Voices arts strategy, which reflects the area's rich heritage through on-site artwork.

Since opening in 2022, the centre has had a significantly positive impact on meeting the local population's needs. My congratulations to the Capital Planning team involved in the planning and delivery of the facility in close partnership with the HSCP and local GP practices, and to Jackie Sands, Environment Arts and Design Development Health Improvement Lead, for supporting the community-based art approach during the process.

Across NHSGGC, we are working towards achieving Equally Safe at Work accreditation, which recognises organisations committed to creating a safe and inclusive workplace, free from gender-based violence and harassment. We are keen for our staff to help shape our current practices and areas for improvement, and our Staff Experience team have launched a survey to gather anonymous feedback. I was pleased to hear about the launch of the Lifelong Smiles programme, which aims to reduce the time families wait before engaging with dental services and to promote alternatives to anaesthesia for dental treatments. New dedicated resources have also been created to help families understand key information, which can be accessed <u>here</u>. My thanks to everyone involved in the creation of this initiative, and I look forward to seeing how it positively impacts families within the communities we serve.
