LEARNING FROM A SIGNIFICANT CASE REVIEW – CHILD P

Learning from cases where children have died or are being significantly harmed is a critical and important part of being a learning and reflective organisation. This allows us to identify good practice and consider where there may be necessary practice changes in order to try and protect other children or young people in the future.

This learning session explores the death and learning from of a young baby who had had a number of health contacts across acute and community before they died.

Reviews are a critical part of the continuous improvement of practice and contributes to formal child protection learning requirements for all health staff.
