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HR Self-Service Portal

National Rail Strike - Plan ahead to avoid disruption

Network Rail have announced there will be three days of industrial action on 21, 23 and 25 June. This will cover all of the UK rail network and will result in the majority of rail services, including ScotRail services, being cancelled on these days. In addition, there is likely to be a residual impact on the days following the industrial action as Network Rail staff return to work and carry out safety critical checks. Recruitment App launch at Royal College of Psychiatrists' International Congress

A number of consultant and trainee psychiatrists are attending the Royal College of Psychiatrists' International Congress in Edinburgh on 20-24 June and their participation in the event will include promotion of NHSGGC as a place to work. In particular, they will be showcasing the many and varied career opportunities available to psychiatrists within NHSGGC, noting our range of specialist and regional mental health services.



This excellent work is being led by Dr Nicola Naven, Consultant Psychiatrist. She will be supported by Dr Nagore Penades, our eHealth lead for Mental Health, who has developed a Recruitment app which will be promoted at the conference. COVID-19 antiviral study

The GETAFIX study, which looks at the effect of antiviral medication on the duration and severity of COVID-19 symptoms is looking for participants.

Those who join the study will be randomly given either a 10-day course of Favipiravir antiviral tablets or no additional treatment.

To be eligible to take part you must have tested positive for COVID-19 and be within the first seven days of symptoms.
