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Learner Pathway - LearnPro Module: NES - Prevention and Management of Occupational Exposure

The NES - Prevention and Management of Occupational Exposure is part of the NES: Scottish IPC Education Pathway – Foundation programme. To access the module in LearnPro, learners need to search for the programme by its full name, '**NES: Scottish IPC Education Pathway – Foundation**'.

Alternatively, you can also find the programme from the home page under the '**Infection Prevention and Control**' category. Searching by the individual module name will not yield results, as the search function uses the course or programme name.

The NES: Scottish IPC Education Pathway – Foundation programme includes the following modules:

- Respiratory and Cough Hygiene
- Hand Hygiene
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- **Prevention and Management of Occupational Exposure**
- Safe Management of Blood and Body Fluid Spillages
- Safe Management of Care Equipment
- Safe Management of Care Environment
- Safe Management of Linen
- Safe Disposal of Waste (including sharps).

The Prevention and Management of Occupational Exposure module must be completed in **LearnPro** to ensure your compliance is recorded accurately and reflected in the NHSGGC monthly compliance emails. Modules undertaken through Turas Learn will not be reflected in NHSGGC compliance.

Playlist for Life – Enhancing Person-Centred Care

Playlist for Life has been rolled out across Acute Services to support person-centred, dementia-friendly care and improve the experience of patients with cognitive impairment. By using personalised music linked to an individual's life, preferences and memories, Playlist for Life can help reduce distress, support emotional wellbeing, and enhance meaningful engagement during hospital stays.



We have a growing network of trained staff supporting delivery at ward level, building confidence and capability to use personalised playlists as part of everyday care.

We have established a network of [Playlist for Life Champions](#) to support local visibility, encourage uptake and help embed this intervention into routine practice. Champions will act as key points of contact within their areas, supporting awareness and sustainability of this work. By embedding Playlist for Life approaches into everyday care, Champions help foster a more person-centred, relationship-based culture across our Acute services.

Staff are encouraged to find out more, get involved, and consider how Playlist for Life can be incorporated into care to further support person-centred approaches and improve patient experience.
