*Personal protective equipment (PPE) for close patient contact (within 1 metre) also applies to the collection of nasal or nasopharyngeal swabs.

Study leave and training

We have received a number of enquires asking for the position on study leave and training. It is important that, during this time, staff ensure they continue to keep their Health and Safety related Statutory and Mandatory training up to date as a minimum i.e. falls prevention, sharps training and moving and handling should be prioritised. Otherwise, all study leave, conferences and developmental training is cancelled and no new requests will be considered until further notice.
