## Staff safety is important to us

The safety of our staff is important to us and we would like to remind all staff of the suite of policies we have around violence reduction.

Health and Safety policies available on HR Connect include: Managing Violence and Aggression, Lone Working and Stalking. Our Security and Threat Policy is also available. <u>Policies, Guidance Documents and Forms - NHSGGC</u>.

We also have the following support available - <u>Self help for staff - NHSGGC</u> and <u>Mental Health and Wellbeing - NHSGGC</u>.

These include a self-referral to Occupational Health including counselling services.

Should anything get to a formal legal stage, the Legal Office also offer support and guidance - <u>NHS Staff Witness Support - NHSGGC</u>.

Health and Safety Violence Reduction Service have also previously given support to services in the form of site visits and also individual support.

Staff are also encouraged/required to report all incidents of verbal abuse/aggression, stalking and harassment, security threats, threats of or actual physical violence/aggression, or inappropriate social media posts pertaining to NHSGGC staff and services, on Datix and Police Scotland.

### Children and Young People with Exceptional Health Care Needs Protocol

The Children's Services protocol will be implemented from today (Monday 17 April 2023) with all information sourced in the NHSGGC clinical guidelines site, visit:

This Protocol was developed by a multidisciplinary group of professionals working within children's health services. It was in response to actions from a significant case incident (SCI) and was to improve coordination, communication and collaboration of care for children with complex needs and vulnerabilities.

The protocol adopts GIRFEC (Getting it Right for every Child) practice model, in developing the role of Lead Health Professional (LHP) and Team Around the Child (TAC) and a single health coordination plan.

It sets out clearly the responsibilities of all professionals working in children's health services in the Board for the promotion of team working, information sharing and effective professional to professional communication, in the provision of complex children centred care.

Within the guidelines page is PowerPoint presentation to support practitioners while the LearnPro module is under construction.

### Road closure for emergency water main repair

An emergency repair to a water main in the Anniesland area of Glasgow will begin on Tuesday 18 April 2023 and is expected to last approximately one week.

A pipe is leaking underneath the southbound carriageway of Crow Road between Ancaster Drive and Sackville Avenue and that section of the road will need to close.

Traffic management has been agreed with Glasgow City Council and will involve a diversion along Anniesland Road, Queen Victoria Drive and back along Dumbarton Road. The northbound carriageway of Crow Road will be unaffected.
