



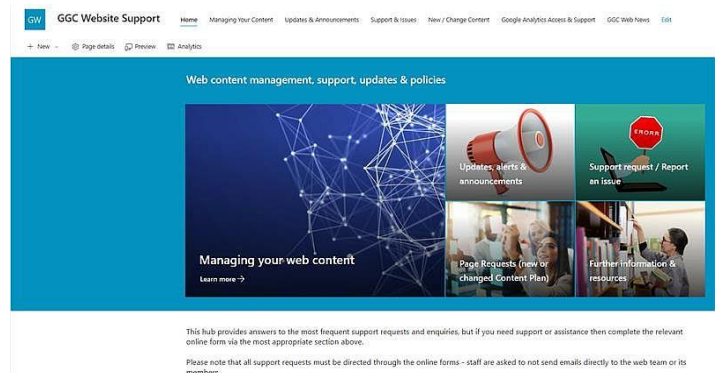

WestCAP brings multidisciplinary teams together to improve limb salvage

The inaugural **WestCAP Multidisciplinary Limb Salvage Conference** took place at the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital on 13 August, bringing together more than 70 colleagues with a shared interest in improving outcomes for people at risk of limb loss.

WestCAP (West of Scotland Collaborative for Amputation Prevention) was established to encourage collaboration, shared learning and quality improvement across the many specialties involved in limb salvage.



The conference brought together colleagues from vascular surgery, podiatry, diabetes, interventional radiology, infectious diseases, orthopaedics, pharmacy, physiotherapy, orthotics, prosthetics and rehabilitation. Sessions explored contemporary approaches to diabetic foot disease, revascularisation, infection, offloading, medicines optimisation and rehabilitation, alongside interactive discussion of real-world limb salvage cases.

The meeting also provided an opportunity to identify priorities for future collaborative work, including quality improvement projects, pathway development and sharing good practice across services.

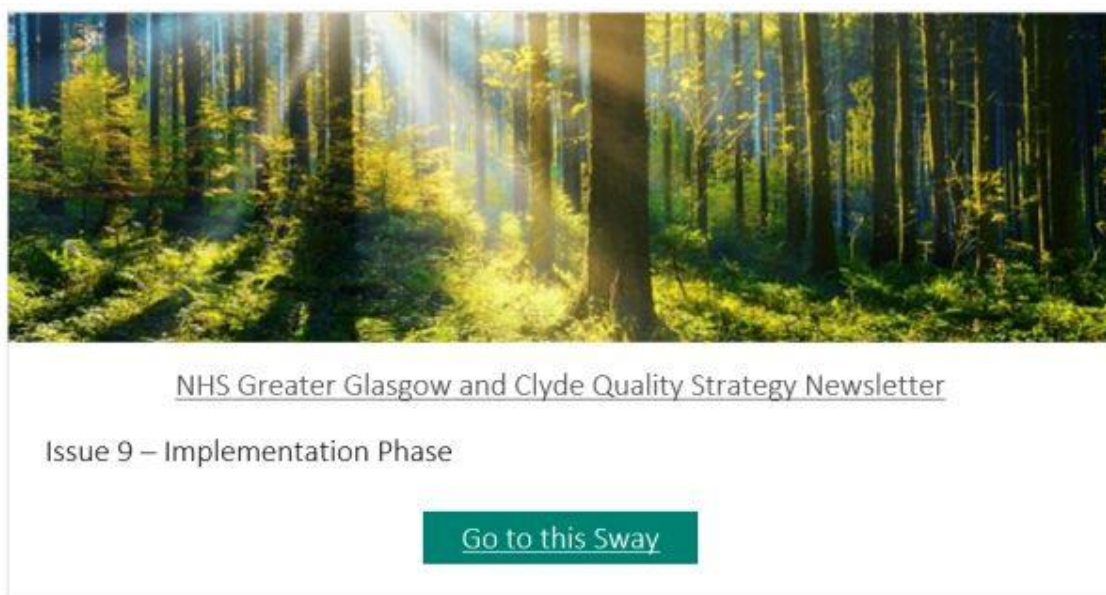
WestCAP will now look to build on the connections made at the meeting and develop further opportunities for multidisciplinary collaboration across West of Scotland and beyond.
