Public Protection is a priority for NHSGGC

The <u>Public Protection Service Learning and Education</u> <u>Framework October 2023 – October 2024</u> was approved by the Public Protection Forum in November 2023. This Learning and Education Framework sets out a structure that describes the public protection learning requirements for all staff in NHSGGC, including independent contractors. All NHSGGC



employees, GP and dental practices, and other independent contractors have a role in protecting the public and all regulated staff in Health Boards and services have professional duties to protect children (including unborn babies) and adults.



Staff are reminded to make sure their personal contact details are up to date on eESS.
