Roadworks - QEUH

We have been advised Scottish Power will be carrying out essential repairs on Govan Road and Moss Road from Monday 24 June 2024 for approximately three weeks. As a result, there will be lane restrictions on Govan Road and Moss Road and a three way traffic control at the site entrance to QEUH at the Langlands Drive/Govan Road junction. To accommodate the traffic control, temporary traffic lights will be situated in the Campus across from the entrance to car park 5 and access to and from the campus at this junction will be significantly compromised.

Transport engineers will be on-site to manually control traffic lights and help promote traffic flow on and off-site and minimise congestion within the campus. However, disruption is likely – especially at peak times - for patients, visitors and staff, and it would be prudent to allow extra time for your journey to and from the QEUH campus.
