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Clinical Guidelines Week returns this September, 14 – 18 September

Following the success of our recent Clinical Guidelines Week, we are delighted to be hosting a second week, taking place from **Monday 14 September to Friday 18 September 2026**.

The week will provide an opportunity for colleagues to learn more about clinical guidelines and their use across NHSGGC through a series of short online sessions.

Practical Tips for Guideline Development and Review is aimed at colleagues developing, reviewing or updating guidelines, while **Finding NHSGGC Clinical Guidelines: a quick guide** will be a short demo on how to search and find NHSGGC Clinical Guidelines available on the Right Decision Service.

Sessions will take place over lunchtime and will be open to all staff with an interest in clinical guidelines.

The optional 10-minute “Clinical Guidelines Surgery” will be an opportunity for attendees to stay on after the session to ask questions about guideline development, review, approval processes, or the Clinical Guidelines Toolkit.
