# New COVID HR Support Team

A new COVID HR Support Team is currently being put in place to support COVID managers, employees and hot spot areas.

The Team aims to -

- Support managers with COVID absences, including accurate recording
- Support employees absent due to COVID, including booking tests
- Support Heads of HR/ HR Managers through commissioned work regarding COVID hot spot areas
- Respond to COVID enquiries and ensure information is up to date and available via HR Connect

One of the main functions of the team will be supporting managers and employees relating to COVID absences. When an employee reports that they are unable to attend work due to COVID, the manager will be asked to inform the COVID HR Support Team who will then contact the employee to ascertain any support needed, including booking a test.

A dedicated HR support team will also mean that COVID related enquiries can be resolved quickly and any enquiry trends identified and actioned. A <u>Manager's Quick Guide</u> has already been produced in response to recent COVID enquiries.
