NHSGGC AHP Learning & Development Strategic Framework 2023-2028

As the Allied Health Professions Director for NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde (NHSGGC), it gives me great pleasure to introduce the launch of the NHSGGC AHP Learning and Development Strategic Framework. The continued learning opportunities for our AHP workforce is of vital importance, in consolidating the services we deliver today, and ensuring our teams are enabled to deliver the services and roles we aspire to in the future.

The NHSGGC AHP Learning and Development Framework has been designed to support all AHP staff in NHSGGC access educational opportunities at all levels of practice across the career framework, from Health Care Support Worker to Advanced and Consultant level of practice.

The framework highlights that all staff will have equal access to ongoing learning, training and development within their role, and recognises that AHP capabilities are required of all staff across the four pillars of practice – clinical practice, facilitating learning, leadership, and evidence, research and development (including service improvement).

The framework was developed by Professional and Service Leads following an AHP staff communication exercise, is underpinned by the four pillars of practice and aligned with local and national policy drivers. It has been developed so that it is accessible, easy to understand and is key to supporting AHPs taking ownership of their learning and development. The framework is a live resource to support meaningful role and career conversations.
