Upcoming Postal Disruption

Royal Mail have confirmed that there will be strike action taking place on the following dates: **Tuesday 25** October, Wednesday 2 November, Thursday 3 November and Friday 4 November.

While talks between Royal Mail and the Communication Workers Union (CWU) continue in an attempt to avert industrial action, NHSGGC staff are asked to send post items as early as possible in advance of the strike dates in order to minimise potential disruption.

Applications are now open for the second round of the Innovation Fellowship Scheme, following a hugely successful Cohort 1 intake.

Cohort 2 is targeted at early stage innovators working across NHS Scotland, offering the opportunity for clinicians to a higher degree (MD or PhD) early in their career. The scheme is 100 per cent funded and includes university fees.

Applications for Cohort 2 close on November 30, and potential candidates are invited to attend an information session on Tuesday October 25 at 1:00pm. The aim of the Innovation Fellowship Scheme is to strengthen the innovation culture to solve real problems in the NHS and social care, improving the quality, efficiency and sustainability of health and care delivery and supporting NHS Scotland's Re-mobilise, Recover, Re-design Framework.

Successful candidates for Cohort 2 will be invited to apply for a PhD or MD to carry out a project across key themes, set to align with NHS Scotland national priorities and the SHIP (Scottish Heath and Industry Partnership) Signalling Plan.
