

Message from Jane Grant, Chief Executive (25 November 2022, 2.20pm)

As we move further into the winter, we are experiencing some challenging situations across health and social care. Our teams within all of our EDs remain exceptionally busy and as such, we are continuing our campaign to encourage people to consider all care and treatment options available to them. This week, we have also seen a significant increase in the number of attendances to our ED at the RHC, with many of the families presenting with non-urgent issues. To support the RHC team, we have issued a reminder to parents about the alternative options to accident and emergency. As with our adult patients, local GP and pharmacy services, along with NHS Inform and NHS 24 are available for children, and I would like to reassure staff that we will continue to encourage members of the public to seek treatment from the most appropriate service. This is even more important as the weather inevitably worsens and we begin to see more accidents, such as slips and trips, which can result in minor injuries.

I was pleased to see a number of our staff celebrating Nursing Support Workers Day this week. Our teams of Nursing Support Workers provide a vital contribution to patient care in our wards, clinics and social care settings, working with both children and adults right across mental and physical health. To all of our healthcare support workers, thank you for all that you do across NHSGGC to support our patients and your colleagues.

I would like to congratulate three of our Pharmacy team on receiving their Royal Pharmaceutical Society (RPS) Fellowship certificates this week after being appointed as Fellows earlier this year. Being appointed a Fellow of the RPS is one of the highest accolades within the service as it recognises the distinction members have attained in their pharmacy career. Paul Forsyth is currently Lead Pharmacist for Clinical Cardiology with NHSGGC and has held a number of key practice and leadership posts across Scotland as well as a number of national professional positions in Cardiology and in pharmacy. Alasdair Macintyre, is a Community Pharmacist in Glasgow who was, until recently, the Chair of the Community Pharmacy contractors committee for NHSGGC. Peter Mulholland is currently a neonatal pharmacist at the RHC, and has been a member of the Neonatal and Paediatric Pharmacists Group (NPPG) since its foundation in 1994. My sincere congratulations to Paul, Alasdair and Peter for the recognition you have received, and thank you for all that you do within pharmacy to support the patients and pharmacy teams across NHSGGC.
