Topics in this Core Brief:

- Urgent message from eHealth – return to using HEPMA

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Clinical areas should now return to using HEPMA.

NHSGGC will continue to monitor system performance closely.

## Returning to using HEPMA

- Any prescribing that was recorded on paper, including new medicines, changes to existing medicines, and discontinuation, **MUST be entered onto HEPMA as soon as possible.**
- Any paper records that were used today must be put into the patient's scanning folder or uploaded into the patient's electronic record.
- Any outstanding HEPMA doses from the business continuity period will automatically be closed off.

**Please do NOT go back to business continuity processes unless this is formally communicated.**
