Progress during first full year of NHSGGC's Sexual Harassment: Cut It Out programme

This week marks one year since our anti-sexual harassment programme, Cut It Out, was approved by the Board and we signalled our intent to work towards Equally Safe at Work (ESaW) accreditation.

Sexual Harassment: Cut It Out was established to help build confidence in those who have seen or experienced any kind of harassment to be able to recognise and report it, and to make clear our zero tolerance approach to sexual harassment.

During this first year, we have:

- Established a programme board to oversee Cut It Out and Equally Safe at Work.
- Launched an [online resource pack](#) for all staff.
- Provided [Active Bystander Training](#) for over 500 staff, providing staff with tools to challenge inappropriate behaviour
- Launched a new Speak Up! online [learning module](#) (module 330) so all staff know how to raise issues and concerns.
- Developed and launched a new [Sexual Harassment online training module](#) as part of our people management programme, with over 200 managers trained to date.
- Conducted the Equally Safe at Work survey with our staff and completed a number of focus groups with women in our workforce who don't have NHSGGC accounts.

- Visited staff groups, management teams and local partnership forums across NHSGGC to spread the word about how we share the message with all staff.
- Raised awareness of support available through posters and leaflets at all our sites.

[Plan More Stress Less: Wednesday 7 May, 6.30pm-7.30pm](#)

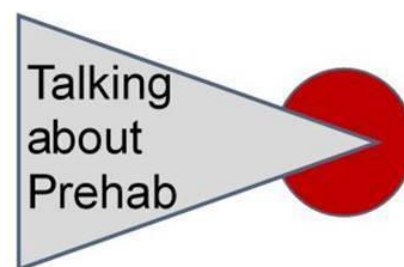

Glasgow Hospital Radio Team recognised among best in the UK

Two NHSGGC staff members were recently recognised at the 2025 National Hospital Radio Awards, placing in the top five DJs in the country. The GRI's Graeme Ferguson was celebrated for his weekly Friday evening Rock Show, while

the Dental Hospital's Chris Bennetts got a top five place for the Monday evening patient request show he hosts with fellow volunteer Ross Turnbull.



Glasgow's Hospital Broadcasting Service was also confirmed as being one of the top five stations in the UK, with volunteers providing patient-focussed shows 7-days a week from studios in the city centre.
