NHSGGC has been made aware of a Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) announcement linked to the NMC's historical process for considering health and character declarations by nurses, midwives and nursing associates through its registration and revalidation processes. As employers, we will support the NMC as it works to resolve this issue.

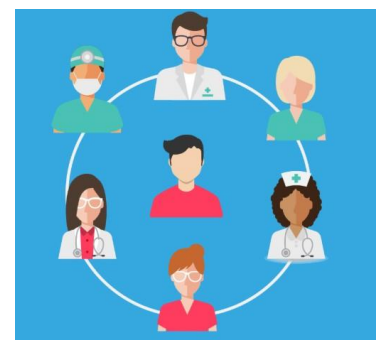
As a result of the review, a small number of staff may be contacted directly by NMC to provide further information in relation to their health and character declarations. We recognise that receiving a letter from the NMC may feel worrying or unsettling, and we are here to support you. If you have received a letter or are affected by this announcement and would like to talk things through or access support, please contact your line manager, Human Resources, or your professional lead.

If you are contacted by the NMC, you should inform your line manager and Vivienne Davidson (ggc.nmcreferals@nhs.scot), Lead Nurse, Professional Regulation and Policy. This ensures we have the appropriate governance arrangements in place to support you and manage any communication with the NMC.

QEUH Roadworks: 1 – 16 June 2026

Glasgow City Council are carrying out carriageway repairs on Hardgate Road, adjacent to QEUH, from 1 – 16 June 2026. The work will be completed in 3 phases. Phase 1 will be on Hardgate Road at the junction of Hospital Boulevard entrance, at multi-storey car park 1. This work will be completed from 19:00 to 06:00 each evening from 1 – 7 June. Temporary traffic lights will be in place at the junction of Hardgate Road and Hospital Boulevard.

Delays can be expected, particularly at peak times. Please allow additional time for your journey and consider an alternative route if possible. The site entrances on Govan Road
