Pauline Ward, Advanced Nurse Practitioner (ANP) Care Home Team (HSCP) won Leader of the Year. In just 18 months, Pauline prove herself to be an exemplary leader within the Care Home ANP Team. Pauline's contributions not only redefined the team's structure but also elevated the standards of care and collaboration within our HSCP.

Employee of the Year was awarded to Liam Logue, Social Care Worker, Housing First. Liam brings a brightness to the working environment and is known for going the extra mile for the service users he works with. He was nominated by his whole team!

The Innovation of the Year winner was The Thistle Project Team. The team developed and delivered the UK's first Safer Drug Consumption Facility, The Thistle. A truly unique service, the implementation of which required innovative solutions to many service requirements never previously encountered within UK health environments.

He enables inpatients, staff and visitors the chance to pause, enjoy a cuppa, play chess, a board or card game, or simply spend time with someone who has experience of the issues that can impact on good mental health and overall wellbeing.
