# Am I eligible for the winter vaccinations?

All health and social care staff members are eligible to receive the flu vaccination. You will only receive the COVID-19 vaccination if you have face-to-face contact with patients or service users, unless you are eligible because of your age, carer status and/or health condition.

# How can I book an appointment?

**Non-frontline health and social care team members** can make appointments now to receive their flu vaccine between 4th September to 1st October 2023. To book your appointment visit: <u>Login - Customer Service (nhs.scot)</u>

# Any appointments booked for earlier than 4<sup>th</sup> September will not available on the day.

# BOOK MY WINTER VACCINATION APPOINTMENT NOW

**Frontline health and social care team members** can make appointments now to receive their flu and COVID-19 vaccine between 2nd of October to 15th October 2023.

# Any appointments booked for earlier than 2<sup>nd</sup> October will not available on the day.

If you do not remember your username or password, then follow the link on the portal to recover it. To do this, you will need one date of a previous COVID vaccination. If you have the COVID status app, you can use this to get the date of your vaccination(s).
