To support colleagues at a time of significant pressure, we have continued to issue public messages to encourage the patients to use our services appropriately. In the latest series of messages today, we have updated our Right Care, Right Place messaging on the NHSGGC website and sent the advice out via the Involving Public Network and our social media channels. Between these channels we have more than 150,000 followers and within minutes thousands had already read the message.



We have also issued a 'Home for Hogmanay' press release to all major

media outlets updating our Home for Lunch message, appealing to families to support you by taking home their loved one before lunch if possible.

Finally, we also used our social media channels to highlight the importance of visitors not attending our sites if they have Covid, flu or norovirus symptoms.

We will continue to promote these important messages throughout the coming days. If you follow any of our accounts, I would ask you to consider re-sharing the messages to help us reach as many people as possible.

Staff are reminded the accurate completion of a death certificate and IDL should take place as quickly as possible for a deceased patient. This will ensure the deceased can be moved to the mortuary in a timely manner.

This will also assist the deceased family as well as contributing to the internal movement to help create capacity.
