## Message from Jane Grant, Chief Executive (29 September 2023, 12.30pm)

It was fantastic to see all of the activities that took place across NHSGGC last week in support of Organ and Tissue Donation Week. In a remarkable week for transplants at the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital, the team undertook twelve kidney transplant operations between Friday 15th and Friday 22nd of September 2023, three of which were from live donors. I would like to add my thanks to those of the patients on Renal Ward who praised our transplant coordinators, nursing, and surgical teams for their care and agility in what was a very significant week for kidney transplants.

This week is Scotland's Climate Week, which this year is focussed on tackling climate change and ways in which we can work towards achieving net zero. To mark the week, NHSGGC officially launched its <a href="Climate Change and SustainabilityStrategy">Climate Change and SustainabilityStrategy</a>. I would like to thank our Recruitment team, with support from our Practice Educations Facilitators, for their hard work onboarding all of our new colleagues. I would also like to welcome the latest recruits from our international recruitment programme. Around 230 nurses have been offered employment with us and already 106 have joined our teams. A multidisciplinary oversight group is supporting the onboarding and induction phases for our new international staff and my thanks go to all those involved in helping colleagues to settle in Scotland and into their new workplaces.

Ahead of the start of Black History Month 2023, staff from the BME Network will be visiting local sites next week to let staff know more about the work they undertake and sharing information about how you can join. The Network team will be setting up stalls at the entrances of a number of our key sites and you can find out more information on our <u>intranet</u>. This is also your opportunity to tell us your experience of working in NHSGGC, particularly if you are a black or minority ethnic member of staff, so I would like to encourage staff to take the time to speak to the team and look out for more information and details of Black History Month, which will be running throughout October.

This week, our patient feedback is about the Endoscopy team at the Royal Alexandra Hospital. Our patient writes: "On arrival, the staff could not have been any more caring or helpful.
