Weather Warnings – Storm Floris

A number of weather warnings for wind have been issued throughout Scotland from Monday morning, linked to Storm Floris. A yellow warning is in place across the country from 6am – 11.59pm, while an amber warning is in place for some areas from 10am – 10pm.

Forecasts currently indicate the potential for unseasonably strong winds, with gusts of 60–70mph inland and up to 90mph in some exposed areas. A period of heavy rain may also bring localised flooding and hazardous conditions.

All hospitals and clinics will be open as usual tomorrow, and we encourage staff – particularly those who live in areas affected by the amber warning – to make suitable arrangements for getting to work, and to check transport links for delays or cancellations.
