New group established to encourage patient views on cancer care innovation

Cancer patients and their families will share their views on innovative solutions to support their care through a newly-established group.

The Patient and Public Involvement in Innovation group has been established by the West of Scotland Innovation Hub (WoSIH), the Beatson West of Scotland Cancer Centre and the Beatson Cancer Charity.

Its aim is to understand the types of digital, data-driven and device solutions that could best support patients and their families.

The group is being led by Oncologist and Cancer Innovation Lead Professor Ioanna Nixon, Karen Bell, Cancer Research Network Manager at the Beatson, Dr Katriona Brooksbank, Research and Innovation Lead for the WoSIH and NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde, and WoSIH Industry Collaboration Project Manager Ray Syed.

They would like staff to make patients aware they are looking for a broad balance of voices, including people of different genders, ethnic diversities and all backgrounds to join. No special skills are required.
