

## NHSGGC Interim Policy and Procedure for Managing Significant Adverse Events

NHSGGC has approved an interim policy and procedure for managing significant adverse events (SAEs). This decision was made at the Board meeting on 24 June 2025.


The updated approach aims to improve the quality and timeliness of investigations, ensuring quicker feedback to patients and families, and better learning for the organisation. The approach formalises three levels of adverse event review, depending on the event's scale, scope, complexity, and opportunities for learning. This change aligns NHSGGC with the revised national framework from Healthcare Improvement Scotland, which was published in February 2025.

Adverse Event Oversight Groups will also be set up within sectors, directorates, and partnerships to manage and oversee all adverse events within their services.
