COVID symptomatic staff

In accordance with <u>CMO(2023)12.pdf (scot.nhs.uk)</u>, all routine COVID testing has been paused; therefore staff themselves are no longer required to undertake any LFD testing for COVID-19.

If a member of staff has symptoms consistent with COVID they should follow the advice from NHS Inform to stay at home and avoid contact with others: <u>https://www.nhsinform.scot/covid19</u>.

At present, COVID Special Leave is still in place for members of staff who have symptoms consistent with COVID. If the member of staff is unfit to return to work following the COVID Special Leave the absence will revert and be recorded as COVID related sick leave.

Transport update

M8 Woodside Viaduct

From 8.00pm on Friday 6 October until 6.00am on Monday 9 October, A804 Dobbie's Loan eastbound traffic will be diverted to Cowcaddens Road and then onto Port Dundas Road.

Battlefield Road closure

From Monday 9 October 2023 until Friday 24 November 2023, Battlefield Road will be closed to traffic between Overdale Avenue and Overdale Gardens. A diversion has been agreed with Glasgow City Council along Grange Road and Langside Road. Pavements will remain open to pedestrians and for access to local businesses, but this could cause delay for travel to and from New Victoria Hospital.
