Data Security Spotlight – Business Email Compromise

A Business Email Compromise is an action a cyber-criminal undertakes to obtain access to a business email account and imitate the owner's identity. This can lead to emails coming into NHSGGC from organisations which have been compromised and in turn leading to compromise of accounts within the organisation. Fighting Flu. It starts with you.

We're calling on as many staff as possible to take up the flu vaccine.

The flu vaccination is a shield against serious illness, a safeguard for our patients, and a commitment to our shared well-being.

What You Need to Know:

- **Eligibility:** All clinical and non-clinical staff are eligible for the flu vaccination

- **Availability:** Starting Monday 23 September 2024, the flu vaccine will be available to you
- **Staff Flu Vaccination Week:** From September 23 to 27, we're launching Staff Flu Vaccination Week—a week filled with drop-in vaccination clinics dedicated for you across all hospital sites
- **Time out during shift:** There is understanding that, when suitable, staff can go during work hours to receive the vaccine. Please talk to your team lead to ensure you can be released at a time that suits
- **Community clinics:** If you cannot attend a hospital drop-in clinic, don't worry. A list of community clinics will be available on the [NHSGGC website](#) in the coming weeks too.

Why Get Vaccinated?

- **Protection:** The flu vaccine is your best defence against serious illness. It can reduce impact if you contract the virus and prevent hospitalisation
- **Team Effort:** By maximising staff vaccinations, we collectively reduce the risk to our patients and families particularly during the winter period.
