Active Staff – Guided Health Walk

Our next Guided Health Walk is available to book now! On Saturday 25 February, we are heading to Croy Hill and the Antonine Wall



circuit. This interesting circular route takes in two Roman hill forts on the Antonine Wall, both good viewpoints, as well as the Forth and Clyde Canal. The route starts and finishes at Auchinstarry Marina on the canal.

Croy Hill offers commanding views over the surrounding landscape, including the Firth of Forth and hills of Fife to the east, the Kilsyth Hills to the north, and the next fort at Bar Hill to the west. Croy Hill fort was one of 16 known forts along the Antonine Wall, which was built across Scotland's central belt from AD 140. The wall formed the north-western frontier of the Roman Empire.

This walk will take between 4-5 hours at a moderate pace. Total distance is approximately nine miles. Please click here to book!
