Launch of the NHSGGC Quality Improvement Network: 15 March 2024

In 2023, the Scottish Quality and Safety Fellows and Scottish Improvement Leaders (Acute) QI Enquiry Session identified that NHSGGC needed to develop a QI Faculty, Network and Resource Hub for the benefit of both staff and patients.

It would be wonderful to welcome you as a member, so look out for future communications around the launch of the NHSGGC QI Network, at 9.30am - 11.30am on the 15 March 2024 and confirmation of the NHSGGC QI Network Hub SharePoint site "going live" in the near future.
