Working with External Organisations which involve Volunteers – Formal Agreements Required

NHSGGC is proud to work collaboratively with a number of external organisations whose volunteers provide valuable support to patients, families and staff across acute services.

To ensure appropriate governance, assurance and consistency, a standardised **formal agreement template** has now been developed for use across NHSGGC Acute Services. This applies to any arrangement within acute services where volunteers from external organisations are involved, whether this is already established or being newly developed.

Service leads are asked to ensure the template is completed, agreed with the partner organisation, and stored locally in line with NHSGGC policy and procedures.

These agreements help clarify roles and responsibilities, support safe and effective volunteer involvement, and provide assurance around governance, safeguarding and accountability.

NHS Scotland Event 2026 - Call for posters now open!

The NHS Scotland Event 2026 will take place on Monday 21 September at the Technology & Innovation Centre, University of Strathclyde, Glasgow.

This year's Event programme will focus on *Transforming Health and Care Services through Collaboration* – and will be delivered in a hybrid format, giving delegates the option to attend in-person or remotely via our virtual platform. Further information will be available when registration opens in August.

The poster exhibition is an integral part of best practice, learning and sharing at the Event, and will feature around 200 projects that are taking place across NHS Scotland and partner organisations.

Poster abstract submissions are welcome from NHS Scotland employees, our voluntary and partner organisations, and other public or private sector organisations on any aspect of work they are undertaking in, with or on behalf of NHS Scotland.

- The top scoring 100 poster abstracts will be invited to display a poster at the Event as well as in the online poster showcase. Around 25 of these will also be invited to give a short presentation of their work.
- A further 100 poster abstracts will be selected to display their poster in the online poster showcase.

Please note that the closing date for submitting abstracts is Thursday 21 May, however, we ask that you submit your poster abstract to your poster co-ordinator, Lyn.Stirling@nhs.scot by **Tuesday 12 May** so any amendments can be made to the content in time for the deadline.
