Decontamination of Ultrasound Probes

A recommendation from a review of the decontamination of ultrasound probes used invasively (contact with sterile tissue during the intervention) is the requirement to highlight to all clinical teams the necessity to review manufacturers reprocessing instructions. In line with manufacturer's instructions and National guidance for this class of invasive ultrasound probe and independent of whether a sterile sheath is used, this equipment should be sterilised through the Central Decontamination Unit.

Listening to our patients

Listening to our patients, their families and carers, and hearing about their experience of care is extremely important to NHSGGC. Care Opinion is one of the feedback mechanisms that helps us do this.

Care Opinion is an independent organisation and website, where patients, families and carers can share their feedback about their healthcare experiences (<u>www.careopinion.org.uk</u>). The feedback we receive provides us with the opportunity to learn from people that use our services on what is working well and identify any areas of improvement.

Some highlights are shown below, with staff being the most frequently used tag to describe what was good about our services. The key themes from the word cloud are the care our staff provide, their helpfulness and their friendliness.

- 242 patients, relatives and carers shared their feedback via Care Opinion
- 81% of these stories were from patients and service users
- 77% of feedback was positive
- These stories have been viewed on Care Opinion 18,783 times

Band 5 nurses urged to apply for role re-evaluation

Band 5 nursing staff who believe they are working at a higher level are encouraged to apply to have their pay banding re-evaluated now.

The review is open to Band 5 nurses across all fields of practice, specialties and settings, including those working in bank roles.

Successful applicants will see their role upgraded to Agenda for Change Band 6.

To ensure consistency of the application process, a National online digital portal/app has been developed, hosting an online application form. You can access the portal/app from any device, but you will need your NHS email address and sign-in details.

The application includes questions about all aspects of your job including the skills and knowledge required, your responsibilities and working environment. The application form is designed to gather information needed to evaluate your role.

Nurses are asked to discuss their applications with their manager before making the initial submission.
