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Have your say: Help us name the new home for the FNC+Plus and Virtual Hospital

We're inviting staff to help choose a name for the new home of the Flow Navigation Centre Plus (FNC+Plus) and Virtual Hospital, which have moved into the former CMB building on the QEUH campus.

As we continue to transform our services together, we want to honour staff who have shown true innovation in the history of healthcare across the communities we serve.

We have developed a shortlist of names, guided by our values and the purpose of the building.

Now, it's time for you to have your say.

You can choose from:

- **Rebecca Strong**, a pioneering nurse and matron who helped establish professional nursing standards and education in Scotland, and was appointed Matron of Glasgow Royal Infirmary in 1879
- **William Cullen**, a Hamilton-born physician, graduate of the University of Glasgow, chemist and academic whose work laid the foundations for artificial refrigeration
- **Marion Gilchrist**, the first woman to qualify as a doctor in Scotland who later worked at Glasgow Victoria Infirmary.

- **Isobel Wares**, served as Matron of the Southern General Hospital from 1956 until her retirement in 1972, on what is now the QEUH Hospital campus. She is remembered for her long service, leadership and commitment to nursing.
- **Mary Beattie**, the first Matron of the Glasgow City Parish Poorhouse, playing a key leadership role in the care of some of Glasgow's most vulnerable citizens in the late 19th century.
- **Maud Perry Menzies**, a Glasgow public health doctor who led a diphtheria immunisation campaign in Rutherglen, served with the Royal Army Medical Corps in Normandy shortly after D-Day, and later became Principal Medical Officer for Glasgow's school health service.

Information Governance and Data Protection Training

To help support managers and staff with understanding Information Governance and Data Protection obligations the IG Team deliver a number of tailored training sessions to provide insight and understanding of the compliance requirements in this complex area.

If you or your staff are involved in any of the following, the IG Team can provide tailored training sessions for:

Managing Subject Access Requests - The training session will provide an understanding of the legal obligations around all aspects of managing and responding to subject access requests, including applicable policies, recording requests, identifying information in scope, statutory timescales and redacting information.

Managing Data Breach Incidents - The training session will provide an understanding of how to identify a data breach incident, examples of incidents, reporting using Datix, and mitigations & actions to take in the event of a data breach incident.

Corporate Records Management & Information Assets - The training session will provide an understanding on managing corporate records, applicable policies, retention and disposal of records, the national records management code of practice and recording & managing information assets.

Safe Information Handling - The training session will provide a detailed look at applicable policies, identifying what is personal data, best practice managing personal data in the workplace, Fairwarning & appropriate access to clinical records.

Managers have a responsibility to ensure that appropriate training is in place to support roles which have an IG component and are encouraged to get in touch with the IG team to discuss requirements. Sessions can be tailored to meet the needs of the service or staff involved and can be delivered in person or on MS Teams to suit.
